

## World War II/Anne Frank Project

1. You will choose a partner or partners(no more than 3) to work on this project. You may choose to work alone also.
2. Choose a topic from the list of topics you are interested in. Then choose an idea, philosophy, person, invention, or position of one of the categories that came from the main list. Examples: D-Day, Hitler, Atomic Bomb, Holocaust etc...
3. This project will include:
  - a. A written synopsis of the topic you chose. There will be a title page, table of contents, written section(explaining your topic), time line, and graphic or visuals.
  - b. A board representing your topic. The board will consist of a title, visuals with labels, and any other pertinent information.
  - c. The board will be neat, organized, colorful, and legible. It needs to be eye-appealing.
  - d. The board can be, but not limited to, a game showing the topic, a newspaper page reflecting the topic, a diorama, puzzle, collage, or combination of the above. If you have your own idea, come and talk to the teacher.
4. You will have class time to work on this project so bring materials you will need. The teacher will not supply you with colored markers, pencils, or other materials.

Remember the written section needs to be legible. That means it should be typed or hand-written neatly(ink only). **NO PENCIL** on this part. Do not plagiarize from the net or books. Put it into your own words.

The project board needs to be legible and neat also. It needs to be able to be displayed for viewing if necessary. If time allows, you will be presenting your project board to the class.

Remember when you choose a partner, chose one that will do their part as you will be graded on this.
